

Council Notes-February 24, 2010

- On Tuesday, March 2nd from 6-8pm, a public input meeting will be held in the Signal Mountain Middle High School cafeteria to determine how the town's commercial centers will develop or re-develop in the future. All residents are encouraged to attend and to offer their suggestions and comments. The results of this meeting will serve as the basis for a review and revision of the Design Review Commission's design standards, which will determine "the look" for new and remodeled commercial property.
- The council's next regular meeting has been rescheduled for Monday, March 15th at 6:30pm at the Town Hall because the Town Manager and two council members will be attending the Tennessee Municipal Leagues' annual meeting in Nashville on the 8th.
- The Town recently applied for three federal grants through the Transportation Planning Organization: 1) repairs to James Boulevard between River Point and Signal Point Roads to include resurfacing and restoration of the railroad tracks; 2) sidewalk rehabilitation in Old Town to include repair and compliance with the American Disabilities Act; and, 3) construction of a bicycle/pedestrian path along Ridgeway Avenue from the Town Hall to Albert Road. The Council thanks Town Manager Honna Rogers and Public Works Director Loretta Hopper for the complicated and time-consuming process of preparing and submitting the applications by the deadline.
- Orange Grove has asked if the town would be willing to participate in a pilot program to determine the need for a public document shredding service for sensitive materials and records. Orange Grove already provides such service to local businesses and the federal government.
- Visit the town library. There are more than 8,000 volumes of adult fiction, more than 790 DVD's, more than 900 biographies, and 570 books-on-CD at the Signal Mountain Library.
