

Council Notes-April 7, 2010

- At its April 1st regular meeting, the Planning Commission denied a request to subdivide the property at 111 Palisades Drive into 2 lots because it is less than one acre, and the 3 structures on the property lack sufficient setbacks. The Regional Planning Agency had also recommended that the request be denied and suggested the owner might apply for variances from the Board of Zoning and Appeals.
- At its next regular meeting on Monday, April 12th at 6:30pm, the Council will conclude its discussion of the proposed sidewalk along James Boulevard. Thompson Engineering has submitted its final report that takes into consideration the public input from the meeting held on February 3rd. Although Thompson recommends constructing the sidewalk on the golf course side between Maryland and the library, it has identified a way to significantly reduce the number of trees to be removed.
- Recreation Director Jarred Thompson presented a request on March 25th from Signal Mountain Lacrosse asking to be recognized as a town league. The group has met the qualifications by electing a board, creating by-laws, and providing proof of insurance. In addition, it has agreed to remit the town's standard maintenance and non-resident fees as applicable.
- On Thursday, April 22nd at 7pm at the Town Hall, Recreation Director Jarred Thompson and the Recreation Board will host a public input meeting to assess future facility and program needs as a basis for creating a long-range town recreation plan.
- Summer Camps at the MACC (June 7-11) will include a string camp with conductor Robert Bernhardt that will be open to all students in grades 6-12 from the Chattanooga area, and Fletcher Bright will hold 2 master classes. For more information go to signalmountainmacc.org.
