- During the regular council meeting on Monday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, the final report by Kennedy, Coulter, Rushing and Watson (KCRW) that will provide a basis for the revision of town's commercial design standards and signage will be presented.
- At its May 25<sup>th</sup> regular meeting, the Design Review Commission reviewed signage for Eberle Tire and Guthrie's Restaurant as well as the proposed roof color (cottage red) for the Mountain Arts Community Center (MACC) and possibly the demolition of its chimney. Town Attorney Phil Noblett will hold a special training session for the DRC on Wednesday, June 9<sup>th</sup>.
- At its May 27<sup>th</sup> regular meeting, the Board of Zoning Appeals received training from Phil Noblett, who reviewed and explained its powers as defined by the state. The BZA has the power to grant variances to property owners where a demonstrable hardship exists.
- The council and the Tree Board both wish to congratulate rising SMMHS 6<sup>th</sup> grader, Miss Emma Kerley, the winner of the Tennessee State Arbor Day Poster Contest. Miss Kerley's poster placed 6<sup>th</sup> out of 52 in the national contest.
