

Council Notes-June 9, 2010

- At its regular meeting, the Planning Commission approved a request to abandon a portion of a septic system easement on Glamis Circle.
- At its recent agenda meeting, the council heard a presentation from engineer James Cawthorne, who provided drawings and specifications to replace the town's inadequate water lines at Balmoral Drive and Palisades Road. Fire Chief John Vlasis and Chief Randy Parker of Chattanooga were also present. Both agreed that the area lacks sufficient fire hydrants and that the town and the city should work together to install up to 6 hydrants to connect to the new water lines.
- Public Works Director Loretta Hopper reported she had received bids for the LED stoplight and the paving covered by American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds. The bids have been submitted to TDOT for approval along with the bids for the Palisades guardrail project.
- Ms. Hopper shared research with the council on the effectiveness of "rumble strips" for traffic calming and proposed an application process for citizens wishing to have street calming devices installed in their neighborhoods. She also suggested the council consider a proposal from Recycle Bank which would provide curbside recycling service. The council agreed that Ms. Hopper should gather more information for discussion.
- Due to time constraints in gathering public input on a change in roof color, the town has ordered a Georgetown gray dimensional roof for the MACC consistent with the color of the original slate.
- At the regular council meeting on Monday, June 14th, Kennedy, Coulter, Rushing and Watson (KCRW) will present the final report that will provide a basis for the revision of town commercial design standards and signage. In addition, the FY11 Budget Ordinance will have its first reading.
