- James Boulevard between the trolley stop and Alexian is scheduled for repair in 2013. The existing concrete was poured over the wooden railroad ties and as they succumb to rot, the pavement cracks and sinks. The current plan is to remove the railroad ties, repair the concrete, and replace the tracks. The town recognizes the historic value of this section of James and will hold public input meetings before any final plans are made. A grant has been secured to help with the cost.
- As President of the TN DARE Office Association, Sergeant Greg Hill, was responsible for organizing the annual conference this year in Gatlinburg. Over 270 officers from around the state attended. SM Captain Gregg Hall taught seven mandated training sessions, primarily on emergency vehicle operations and child sex abuse investigations.
- Town Manager Honna Rogers and Human Resources Coordinator Gigi Williams attended an update on the projected impact of new Healthcare Legislation on employers. Most changes are expected in 2014.
