- The regular August Planning Commission meeting has been cancelled. However, a work session is planned for Thursday, August 12<sup>th</sup> at the Town Hall at 6pm.
- The council thanks the Water, Public Works, and Storm Water Departments for their excellent work in completing the complicated and difficult repair on Windy Way in Hidden Brook. The road is back in service!
- Building Official Chuck Gearhiser, Engineering Assistant Cliff Fite, and Public Works Administrative Assistant Cathy Campbell along with Town Manager Honna Rogers recently attended a class on the state's new storm water permit. The permit, to be issued soon, will be in effect for 5 years. The permit addresses six areas: 1) public education and outreach; 2) public participation/involvement; 3) illicit discharge detection/elimination; 4) pollution prevention/good housekeeping; 5) construction site runoff control; and, 6) post-construction runoff control. The town will have 90 days to respond with a plan to comply with the new regulations. The Tennessee Department of Environmental Conservation and the Municipal Technical Advisory Service sponsored the class.
- The library wrapped up the Summer Reading Program July 27<sup>th</sup> with a Grand Finale Swimming Party at the town pool with 125 children and parents attending. Children turned in their reading logs and were given certificates and prizes. The library staff served ice cream, compliments of Pruett's Signal Mountain Market, to the crowd.
