

## Council Notes-August 11, 2010

- The Hamilton County Water and Wastewater Treatment Authority (WWTA) is preparing to send a third and final sewer repair notification letter to approximately 100 residents. Residents are asked to respond per the instructions in the letters. Those who aren't on sewer and have received a letter in error are also asked to respond. Those on sewer, who have not received any letter, please contact the town manager. Residents on sewer who don't respond will be penalized by sewer charges 5 times the regular rate.
- There are four phases between the WWTA's initiation of work and a completed repair: Phase 1, plumbers visit property and install cleanouts if needed; Phase 2, the WWTA videos lateral sewer line to assess needed repairs; Phase 3, repairs are completed by plumbers; and, Phase 4, final inspection and testing occur.
- The WWTA will begin Phase 3 repairs in Area 1 between Shoal Creek and the Town Hall. In Area 2A, which begins at the south end of Green Gorge Park and includes the Palisades area, Shepherd Forest, Brow View, Shoal Creek to Ault Road and Albert Road, plumbers are completing Phase 1 repairs and will soon begin Phase 2. Phase 1 repairs in Area 2B, which includes Carriage Hill, Ravine, Cherokee, Whippoorwill, Boulder and portions of Ladder Trail, Pipers Path and Rolling Way, will also begin soon.
- The Planning Commission will meet for a work session on Thursday, August 12<sup>th</sup> at the Town Hall at 6pm.
- The town has been submitted an application for a grant to plant several shade trees in Norris and Andy Anderton Parks.
- The council welcomes three new employees: library assistant Laura Wooden and police officers Brandon Warren and Patrick Miller.
