- The Planning Commission met on August 12 to continue its review and revision of the subdivision regulations. The Commission finalized discussion of Articles II and III and will continue discussion of Article IV at its regular meeting on September 2.
- The MACC Foundation will be sponsoring "Friday Nite Live" at Lynn's Market featuring local musicians every Friday night from 7-10. Lynn's will donate a percentage of food and beverage proceeds to the MACC Foundation to be used for improvements to the MACC.
- The qualifying period has ended and the following candidates will be running for three seats on the Town Council: Jason Bowling, Dick Gee, Frank Preston, Jeremy Rardin, Bill Wallace and incumbent Susan Robertson. Early voting is October 13-28 and the general election is November 2. Be watching for details for pre-election candidate forums.
- The Town Manager has signed the Notice to Proceed documents for the ARRA-funded resurfacing of James Blvd. and Palisades Drive as well as upgrades to the traffic signal. Work will be completed this fall.
- Town Manager Honna Rogers recently attended the Tennessee Association of Utility Districts Business Conference. Topics covered included Wastewater, Greening Infrastructure, Funding Utility Projects, New Technology, and other Utility Management topics.
