

## Council Notes

- At its regular meeting, the Design Review Commission approved signage for the Signal Mountain Business Center (the former Signal Mountain Middle School) and for CLS Lighting & Automation, which will be moving into the space at the shopping center, formerly occupied by Accents, and approved a reconfiguration of doors at Ashley Plaza.
- The DRC discussed the proposed sign ordinance draft: 1) various ways to measure the square footage of signs; 2) the importance of scale, proportion, and graphics; and, 3) the need to include photographs in the draft to provide examples of design, style, and types of signage.
- The *Times Free Press* has asked the council to consider amending its peddler ordinance to allow door-to-door solicitation on Saturdays. Citizens are asked to call the Town Hall to express their opinions. The council will be discussing the possibility of an amendment at its next meeting on Monday, September 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30.
- Greenlife Grocery on Manufacturers Road is accepting #5 plastics for recycling. Since the town is unable to accept #5's, citizens are encouraged to take advantage of Greenlife's service. The bin is located near the dairy case.
- The town is forming an Adopt-A-Stream program. Individuals or groups interested in helping the town improve its water quality are invited to join. Contact Storm Water Director Chuck Gearhiser at the Town Hall for information.
- The Friends of the Library will host its annual Labor Day Book Sale in the Library basement on Monday, September 6<sup>th</sup> from 9-3. Thousands of books will be available at half price.
