- At its regular meeting on September 2nd, the Planning Commission completed its revision of “Design Standards,” Article IV of the Subdivision Regulations. The Commission will review Article V in October.
- At its agenda meeting on September 3rd, the council discussed updates and revisions to the Animal Control ordinance and the Noise Ordinance. The council will continue the discussion of these ordinances as well as an amendment to allow door-to-door soliciting on Saturdays between 10am and 2pm at its September 13th regular meeting.
- The council authorized the town manager to spend \$1,000 to upgrade the new traffic light to allow installation of dedicated left turn arrows for Palisades and Mississippi and \$22,000 to upgrade the fire alarm system to bring the MACC building into compliance with fire codes.
- Dudley Meadows at Alexian Village is organizing a town council candidate’s forum to be held at the Village Town Hall on Wednesday September 22nd at 7pm. The candidates to be interviewed are Jason Bowling, Dick Gee, Frank Preston, Jeremy Rardin, Bill Wallace and incumbent Susan Robertson.
- Vice Mayor Susan Robertson and Councilman Annette Allen attended the inaugural ceremonies for Hamilton County elected officials on September 1st at the Chattanooga Convention Center to congratulate District 2 Commissioner Jim Fields on his election and County Mayor Claude Ramsey on his re-election.
- The town is considering the feasibility of accepting property tax payments on-line. There would be no cost to the town; however, those who pay electronically would incur a personal credit card fee. Citizens interested in such a service are asked to contact the Town Hall.
