- The Planning Commission has scheduled a work session at 6pm, Wednesday, November 17th at the Town Hall to complete its review of Article 5.
- On Monday, November 8th, Attorney Phil Noblett opened the regular town council meeting. He welcomed new council members Dick Gee and Bill Wallace and returning member, Susan Robertson. Mr. Noblett reviewed the duties and responsibilities of the new council according to the Town Charter and directed the council to choose its officers. Bill Lusk was re-elected mayor and Susan Robertson, vice mayor.
- The council read resolutions honoring the SMHS Ladies Golf and Ladies Volleyball Teams for their championship seasons; thanking Dr. Keith Dressler for his generous donations of time and resources to the town and to the SMMHS tennis team; thanking the Falling Water Chapter of the Questers for donating a steam table to the MACC; and, a resolution recognizing and commending Jay Casavant for welcoming over 500 children this year to enjoy his annual Halloween display and tour his maze.
- On first reading, the council approved the abandonment of a right-of-way at the corner of Windy Way and Hidden Brook Lane. The property, which consists of a stub, was originally designed for subdivision expansion. It now serves as a utility easement.
- The following town boards have openings: Zoning Appeals, Design Review, Library, Mountain Arts Community Center, Parks, Personnel, Planning, Recreation, and Tree.
