

Council Notes-February 9, 2011

- At its Feb. 3rd meeting, the Planning Commission discussed amendments to allow horseback riding lessons and boarding in Residential Estate Zones. Topography and paddock area requirements were also considered. The discussion will continue at next month's meeting after further research.
- At its Jan. 31st agenda meeting, the council 1) approved the purchase of two replacement trucks; 2) passed a resolution to celebrate Arbor Day on Friday, March 4th; 3) agreed to hear a presentation from Allied Arts at the council's Feb. 14th meeting; 4) heard the results of a study to expand sewers town-wide for improved water quality from Paul Cate of CTI and suggestions of how the town might finance the \$11 million cost; and, received a report from MACC Chairwoman Sandra McCrea that the MACC would be hosting three public strategic planning meetings in March to explore how it can benefit the community in the future. Dates, times and places are available on the town website.
- Town Manager Honna Rogers reported that at the six months' mark, the FY2011 budget projection is on target and indicates the town will be within budget at the end of the fiscal year.
- Public Works Director Loretta Hopper reported that installation of the town's new LED stoplight will begin in early March. She also asks recyclers not to leave plastic bags at the recycle center. The town does not have the capability to recycle them at this time. Please take them to Walmart. They have both collection containers and the means to recycle plastic bags.
- The town thanks Claude Griffith for his years of service at the Recycling Center and the Transfer Station. We will miss his warm smile and his helpfulness.
