

## Council Notes-May 18, 2011

- At its regular meeting on May 9, Council Member Allen presented a Power Point on the benefits of preserving thirteen town parks and green spaces by entering into conservation easement agreements with The Tennessee River Gorge Trust. - On second reading, the council voted to amend the Low Density Residential Zoning ordinance to allow memorial gardens and columbaria on church property by special permit and to continue to allow door-to-door solicitation on Saturdays by licensed solicitors displaying town-issued photo-identification badges.
- Acting as the Beer Board, the Council approved Alexian Village's application to serve beer and wine on its premises.
- The council approved resolutions authorizing the town manager to accept bids for paving sections of four streets, for striping 38 miles of streets, and for a repair project to the water lines in the Balmoral and Palisades Road area. Resolutions allowing a sidewalk to be built through Memorial Park in order to complete the James Blvd. sidewalk extension and appointing Earl Rothberger to the Tree Board also passed.
- The Design Review Commission held an open house on May 10<sup>th</sup> regarding the proposed sign ordinance revisions. They will consider the comments they received at their next meeting.
