- The Council has scheduled its next Agenda Meeting for August 1<sup>st</sup> at 10:00am. The Council's next regular meeting will be Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm.
- The Planning Commission will meet at 6 pm, August 4<sup>th</sup> to consider Wellington Ford's re-submission of a previously approved subdivision plat that has expired. The Commission will also consider a request to include a mobile kitchen restaurant as a permitted use in a Planned Commerce Center Zoning District.
- The Town will honor retiring Officer Greg Hill for his twenty years of service Monday, August 1, 2:30-5:00 in the MACC Cafeteria. Officer Hill taught the DARE program for 14 years and was the School Resource Officer for the past six. Citizens are invited to come by and thank Officer Hill for his service.
- Public Works reports that final clearance from TDOT to begin work on the James Boulevard sidewalk is expected soon. The next step is a release of a 21-day bid package. Work is expected to begin in the fall.
- Since the log cabin on Timberlinks has deteriorated beyond repair, the council has declared it "Surplus Property." The Town Manager will be advertising the cabin for sale in hopes of finding a buyer to remove and restore it.
- This weekend is the last chance to see the Signal Mountain Playhouse production of "Beauty and the Beast." Ticket sales begin at 6pm. Curtain is at 8pm. Adults are \$15 and children \$5.
- Citizens are asked to remember to trim shrubbery and low-hanging branches back from sidewalks and walkways as required by town ordinance.

- On Saturday, May 7<sup>th</sup> from 8am-2pm, a backhoe will again be on hand to load mulch at the recycle center for \$5 per vehicle.
