- The Planning Commission will meet August 4th at 6pm to consider Wellington Ford's re-submission of a previously approved subdivision plat that has expired. The Commission will also consider a request to include a mobile kitchen restaurant as a permitted use in a Planned Commerce Center Zoning District.
- At its regular meeting on July 26th, the Design Review Commission approved a permanent sign for Eberle Tire and Automotive Repair.
- On July 27th, Mayor Bill Lusk and Town Manager Honna Rogers met with Walden's Ridge Utility District to discuss establishing an emergency water connection that will benefit both communities.
- Chattanooga Mayor Ron Littlefield issued an invitation to local officials to attend a meeting on July 28th in the Chattanooga City Council room for an informal discussion on consolidated government, the possibility of obtaining Home Rule for Hamilton County and the benefits of unified services. He introduced what he called a "Great Twelve Month Challenge" to "streamline, simplify, economize and unify the principal governments" in the area by August 2012. Council Member Bill Wallace, Planning Commission Chairman Melissa Cantrell, and Honna Rogers represented Signal Mountain.

- Since the log cabin on Timberlinks has deteriorated beyond use and repair, the council has declared it "Surplus Property." The Town Manager will be advertising the cabin for sale in hopes of finding a buyer to remove and restore it.
