

Council Notes-April 18, 2012

- The Alexian Village will appear formally before the Design Review Commission at a public meeting on Tuesday, April 24, to request approval for a 5-story, 100,000 square foot addition. Plans will be available for review from 5-6pm. The Alexian attorney will be available to answer questions. The meeting will follow at 6pm.
- At its April 9th regular meeting, 911 Executive Director John Stuermer asked the Council to consider sharing approximately \$900,000 in costs with Hamilton County and its municipalities to up-grade the 911 mapping system. The Council determined that more information was necessary before it could commit. Tree Board member Dr. Jennifer Boyd of UTC gave a presentation on the state of the town's tree canopy. The presentation may be viewed on the town website. The council appointed Jason Royal to the MACC Board; Dick Gee to the WWTa Board; and authorized a contract with Brown Dog Construction to repair Town Hall siding.
- The town has saved \$68,000 since 2010 when it began in-house animal control: owners claimed 14 animals; 4 were adopted; and only 2 were transferred to Cleveland.
- The town manager reported that budget hearings will begin in early May. Currently, almost all departments are 1-12% under budget. She projects a balanced budget at the end of the fiscal year.
- At its April 12th meeting, the Planning Commission denied a request to relocate a lot line on Glamis because the lot doesn't meet Ground Water Protection regulations. The Commission approved a request to abandon a lot line on Dunsinane.
- The Mountain Arts Community Center Board has an opening. Applications are available at the Town Hall or may be downloaded from the town website.
