

Council Notes-July 18, 2012

- At its regular meeting on Monday, July 9th, the council passed resolutions authorizing the town manager to adopt a capital asset disposal policy for tracking and disposing of surplus town property; to purchase a police car for a new officer hired due to the annexation of Fox Run and Windtree; to apply for a TML Risk Management Pool “Safety Partners” Loss Control Matching Grant to assist the town in maintaining a safe and hazard-free workplace; and authorized Town Attorney Phil Noblett to intervene in the petition by TN AM Water Company to increase the town’s water rates. The council also appointed Becky Pope to the MACC Board.
- Mr. Noblett informed the council that the deed to Norris Field dates back to 1923 when it was donated to the public as a children’s playground and ball field. He also discovered the community also used it as a “Liberty Garden” during WWII. The council agreed that allowing ball practice for younger teams is an appropriate use for part of the 3-acre Field.
- The council wishes to thank Finance Director Mark Johnson for over four years of service to the town as he moves on to a new job opportunity. The council has appreciated his support, his competence and his delightful sense of humor. Good luck, Mark!
