- The regular October town council meeting has been rescheduled to Monday, Oct. 1st at 6:30pm. Among the agenda items will be a resolution honoring the memory and legacy of Martha Swasey.
- On Thursday, Sept. 20th, the TN Regulatory Authority held a public hearing at the Hamilton County Court House in response to TN American Water Company's request for a double-digit rate increase. If granted, this increase would be TAWC's third increase in three years. Mayor Bill Lusk, Vice Mayor Susan Robertson, SMGCC President Bobby Morrison, Alexian Village CEO Robin Baschnagel, and citizen Caleb Goggins spoke in opposition to the increase. Councilman Bill Wallace, Planning Commissioner Melissa Cantrell and citizens Frank and Elaine Preston attended in support the town's position.
