

## Council Notes-October 17, 2012

- Five candidates have qualified to run for a seat on the Town Council: Bill Lusk, Annette Allen, Bill Wallace, Joe Dumas, and Frank Preston. Sample ballots are available at the Hamilton County Election Commission website, [elect.hamiltontn.gov](http://elect.hamiltontn.gov).
- Early voting begins today, Wednesday, October 17<sup>th</sup> and continues through Thursday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. Citizens may vote early at the Election Commission off Amnicola Highway Monday-Friday, from 8am-8pm and on Saturday, from 9am-8pm. Citizens may also vote early at the Brainerd Recreation Center; the Eastwood Church; and Northgate Mall, Monday-Saturday from 10am-8pm.
- Tuesday, November 6<sup>th</sup> is Election Day. Voting will take place at the Signal Mountain Presbyterian Church, 612 James Boulevard, from 8am-8pm.
- The Town of Signal Mountain Recycle Center is now accepting Compact Fluorescent light bulbs and 4' florescent tubes. Both contain mercury and are considered household hazardous waste. To assure that the bulbs are handled properly, please give them to the attendant.
- The Town Gym will be closed for the remainder of the month of October to accommodate the installation of a new floor.
- There are openings on the Library Board and the Design Review Commission. Applications may be downloaded from the town website. For information, contact the Town Hall.
- The Public Works Department asks citizens to keep loose leaves and brush separated. These materials are collected, processed and disposed of differently. Mulch loading by the town backhoe at the Recycle Center is suspended until next spring.
