- At its May 13th regular meeting, the Council held a public hearing to review Jack Kruesi's Outline Plan for Wild Ridge at Fox Run, a Planned Unit Development on Shackleford Ridge of 199 homes on 124 acres, and voted to approve the Plan with certain conditions; awarded a bid for pavement striping; deferred an amendment to the Intoxicating Liquors ordinance; and voted to amend the Sign Regulations on first reading.
- In other business, the Council appointed Chris Dorsey town manager with a review in 6 months. He will begin work on Monday, June 17. The Council appointed Police Chief Boyd Veal interim town manager.
- Honna Rogers' last day is May 24. Stop by Town Hall to thank her and wish her well!
- The Town's paving contractor has delayed the start of work until Tuesday, May 28th. Work is expected to be completed the following Tuesday, June 4th. Roads scheduled for re-paving are James Boulevard from Timberlinks to Rolling Way; a section of Palisades Drive; the entrance to Carriage Hill; Stonehaven Drive; Hampton Road; Mayer Street; South Street; St. Charles; and Stratford Way from James to Primrose.
- The swimming pool will open May 25. Purchase season passes or resident cards at the Town Hall now. Also, register for playground camp, swimming lessons or pick-up basketball.
- Town offices and public works will be closed for the Memorial Day holiday, Monday, May 27. Monday garbage collection has been re-scheduled for Tuesday, May 28.
