

## Council Notes-July 24, 2013

- At the July 8 regular Town Council meeting, Lions Club President Louis Glendenning thanked town employees, the council and the community for their support in making the 4th of July BBQ a success despite the rain. The council passed a resolution honoring Water Department employee, John Hayden Hicks, for being the only one of 187 trainees to pass the final exam to become a Grade I Distribution System Operator; authorized the purchase of a Public Works dump truck and final payment to Thompson Engineering for the James Blvd. sidewalk; appointed Town Manager Chris Dorsey as proxy for the mayor on the Chatt-Hamilton Co./N. Ga. Transportation Planning Organization; adopted a Bank Resolution for signatories on behalf of the town; and approved hiring a short-term manager and coordinator for this year's Fall Hodgepodge.
- At its regular meeting on July 11, the Planning Commission approved the Preliminary Plat for Wild Ridge at Fox Run, a planned unit development on Shackleford Ridge Road. Under other discussion, Dr. Bob Spaulding asked the Commission to explain the intent behind certain zoning requirements. The Commission referred him to Town Attorney Phil Noblett, who is its authority on zoning.
- A public input meeting on the James Boulevard resurfacing project will be held on Thursday, August 22, at 6pm at the Town Hall.
- Illegal solicitors have been canvassing the town. Please ask every solicitor to show a town-issued permit and photo ID. If they can't, call 886-2124 and report them.
- Public Works announced its summer hours: 7am-3:30pm, Monday through Friday. Saturday hours are unchanged. Please have garbage at the curb by 7am.
