- On July 31, the Conservation Easement Working Group met with Sarah O'Rear of the Land Trust for TN to discuss potential improvements (parking areas, restrooms, backpacking shelters, etc.) for each park to be included in the draft conservation easement agreement.
- At its August 1 meeting, the Planning Commission discussed potential amendments to the Zoning Ordinance to accommodate the new Subdivision Regulations.
