

Council Notes-February 12, 2014

- In anticipation of creating a Facilities Maintenance and Improvement Fund, which would operate much like the town's vehicle replacement fund, town staff has conducted an assessment of town facilities to determine immediate and future necessary maintenance and potential improvements. The assessment includes facilities at the Town Hall complex, the water shop, pumping station, library, playhouse, and ball fields. The estimate does not include capital projects such as a new public works facility, a fire substation on Shackleford Road or renovations at the MACC.
- Normally, the final round of leaf collection is completed by mid-January. This season, fall rains and freezing winter temperatures have hampered the process. The final round of pickup has begun in Area 4 (Carriage Hill/Palisades), but has been bogged down due to weather. The leaf crew will move into Area 5 next followed by Areas 1, 2, and 3 until leaf collection is complete. The Interim Town Manager has authorized over-time for leaf crews so that they can work weekends if weather permits.
- The Signal Mountain Playhouse will present "The Curious Savage" each Friday and Saturday evening in February at the MACC. Coffee and dessert will be served in the cafeteria beginning at 6:45pm. The curtain goes up at 8pm. Tickets are \$14 per person.
