

Council Notes-February 26, 2014

- The council will meet on Friday, February 28, to discuss purchasing three police vehicles due for replacement under the Vehicle Replacement Plan; to review proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance relating to accessory structures and swimming pools; and to set the agenda for its next regular meeting on March 10 at 6:30pm.
- At its regular meeting on Thursday, March 6, the Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on proposed amendments clarifying language in the Subdivision Regulations, followed by a vote. The Commission will also continue to review and clarify the language in the Zoning Ordinance.
- The Conservation Easement Working Group will seek citizen input on its easement agreement draft at public meetings on Wednesday, March 12, and Thursday, March 13, from 4-8pm. This agreement would protect Rainbow Lake and certain other parklands from future development.
- Artech is expected to deliver its final draft of plans for the new public works facility for review by Public Works Director Loretta Hopper, Building Inspector Chuck Martin, and Interim Town Manager Boyd Veal by the end of the month.
- CTI has recently conducted flow testing on South Palisades, Brady Point, Laurel and the area of James Blvd. to be resurfaced as part of its plan to improve the town's water system.
- Interim Town Manger Boyd Veal recently attended the Hamilton County Joint Economic and Community Development Board meeting at the Southeast Tennessee Development District office. The STDD works to assist with regional planning, grant opportunities, historical preservation, transportation and infrastructure development.
- Leaf collection crews are taking advantage of the daylight hours and the weather. Area 5 (Fox Run/Windtree) is almost complete. Area 1 (Old Town) is next.
