

## Council Notes-March 19, 2014

- At its regular meeting on March 10, the council, acting as the Beer Board, approved an application for a consumer/carry-out beer permit for the Olive Bean, a new grocery cafe scheduled to open on March 31 in the space on James Boulevard formerly occupied by Sweet Gipsy.
- The council read resolutions commending and recognizing the Public Works, Water, and Recreation Departments for their dedication and service to the town during the frigid weather this winter. Councilwoman Annette Allen personally thanked the town's emergency responders from the Police and Fire Departments as well.
- In other business, the council resolved to adopt bank form resolutions that grant authority to council members and the administrative staff for the purpose of signing town checks; read an initial resolution that authorizes the town to incur indebtedness up to \$3,000,000 through the TN Municipal Bond Fund to be used for certain public works projects and incidental and necessary expenses related thereto; authorized the town manager to purchase two light duty dump trucks under the Vehicle Replacement Plan; and on first reading passed two ordinances 1) a budget amendment for 2013-14 to provide for certain additional revenues and expenditures, and 2) to amend Article III, Section 303 and Article VIII of the Zoning Ordinance related to accessory structures and swimming pools.

- Leaf collection is complete and brush collection has begun. The council thanks citizens for their patience regarding the delay in leaf collection caused by the frigid winter weather this year.
