- Public Works Director Loretta Hopper reports that paving and striping on Brook's Edge Lane, Chamblee Court, Cool Springs Road, Creekshire Drive, Middle Creek Road, Mountain Cove Road, Northfield Road, Fortune's Way and Prentice Lane have been successfully completed and thanks the community for its cooperation and patience throughout the project.
- At its regular meeting on June 24, the Design Review Commission approved signage for Dr. Robert Spalding and discussed potential amendments to the Sign Regulations related to windows and subdivision entrances.
- Celebrate the 4th of July! Line Up at 9am for the Mountain Business Association's Parade: cars on Signal Point Road, floats on Ohio, and walkers and bikers in front of the Alexian Village. The parade begins at 10am. The parade route will be down James to Texas to the Signal Mountain Golf and Country Club. The Lion's Club BBQ and festivities will follow at Althaus Park. A fireworks display at the golf course will begin at dark.
- The town has entered into a contract with the Hamilton County Humane Education Society to provide backup to the Police Department's Animal Control Program. The town will still be responsible for animal control on a day-to-day basis, but the HES will provide assistance in placing homeless pets and dealing with vicious or ill domestic animals. Call the Police Department at 886-2124 (or after business hours, 886-2123).
- Town offices, the Recycle Center, and the Transfer Station will be closed on Friday, July 4. Garbage collection scheduled for that day will occur Thursday, July 3 instead.
- The town will load mulch on Saturday, July 12 from 9am until 2pm at the Recycle Center. This cost is \$5 a load.
